LPSNY CLUBNOTES, LETTERS, BALTIC PHILATELIC ACTIVITY

I regret to have to inform you that I will not be renewing my subscription to the Lithuanian Philatelic Society. In the last few years I have had to discontinue some memberships in foreign (non-Canadian) societies due to economic considerations.

\*\*\*\*\*

I wish to congratulate you on the Lithuanian Bulletin; wonderful, improving with each issue received. I know what work goes into each issue. I used to put out a bulletin for the Boston Philatelic Society when it was active.

On my trip to Lithuania, I got once again interested in collecting Lithuanian stamps. This comes to my purpose for this letter. In Lithuania, I bought some stamps along with a catalog of Lithuanian stamps. Lately I purchased pre-war issue stamps, but now need an album to put them in. I see in issue #165 you had two albums in stock and are now sold out. When and if you get a hold of an album I'd be most grateful to purchase one.

\*\*\*\*\*

I bought from you a Lithuanian Postage Stamp Album, which has not been used and which is available if anyone inquires. Could it possibly be included in your auction listing? (Ed. Note - See Auction Lot # 148)

\*\*\*\*\*

As a new member, I want to protest full Scott minimum bids in your auction. My friends in the three Baltic republics say the prices listed are too high on pre-war stamps. I have been offered direct from a very large philatelic firm in Lithuania, mint or used stamps from 1920 to 1940 at 50% of Scott.

(Ed. Note - The prices set in our auctions are set by the consignors, not by the auction managers. All members are able to consign their material. Only if the auction manager feels the price set by the consignor is so high as to be detrimental to the LPSNY and or stamp collecting does the auction manager reject a lot. Having said the above, the lots run in our most recent auctions were only rarely 100% of Scott, most were or are 70 - 80% of Scott and all lots, in my opinion, were priced in line with the market. Many members also thought so; they purchased them. If a collector is willing to send his money to a dealer in Lithuania to buy pre-war stamps and to have them sent out of the country, he should know that without a proper export license his transaction is illegal. He should also know that if the dealer stiffes him, his recourse will be to visit Lithuania to "persuade" the dealer to give up the material, hire someone to do the "persuading" for him, or learn a lesson. To summarize, unless the laws in Lithuania have changed in the last few days, there is no recourse through their courts or otherwise re this type of transaction.)

# Price Changes in Lithuanian Stamps in the 1994 Scott Stamp Catalog

1994 Scott Stamp Catalog "retail" prices show surprising strength for the issues of newly independent Lithuania. There were no value reductions in Lithuania's new issues from 1993 listings, while many new Estonian and Latvian issues declined, in many cases, by over 50%. (Conversely, the new 1994 Michel Europa Ost catalog does revalue downward many new Lithuanian issues.)

An innovation in the 1994 Scott catalog is valuations for "never hinged (NH)" sets, following the lead of the Michel catalogs. Such valuations account for the majority of price increases tabulated below, which range all the way up to a 267% premium for the NH set of #114-115 ("Surcharged Issue"). Errors, variations and imperforate pairs account for the remainder of the many increases -- not a single ordinary issue increased in valuation, apart from consideration of the state of its gum.

Conversely, the only two Lithuanian items to lose value: 1) #259, the Lituanica II diagonal overprint, which now must be in NH condition to maintain a Scott valuation of \$250, and 2) souvenir sheet #309B, the imperforate "20th Anniversary of Independence Issue," which also must be NH to maintain its 1993 valuation.

### Pope John Paul II's Visit to Lithuania

These four stamps, commemorating the first visit of any Pope to Lithuania, were designed by A. Repšys and printed in Leipzig, Germany by offset on white paper, with shiny gum, in sheets of 50, perforated 13 1/2 x 13 1/4. Each stamp in this set shows the Pope against a local backdrop. The Polish-born Pope's mother, Emilija Kacerauskaite, was of Lithuanian descent and he asked to visit Lithuania many times in the 1980's. Each time he was turned away by officials fearful of anti-communist demonstrations.

**77: 60ct Šiluva;** flesh and greenish grays; (Mi #533)  
Printing: 500,000

The Pope visited Šiluva September 7 to visit one of Lithuania's holiest Catholic shrines, the Chapel of the Apparition of Mary, completed in 1924 and depicted on this stamp. Šiluva is a town of a thousand residents 40 miles north of Raseiniai in western Lithuania. Festivals celebrating the Nativity of Mary began here the middle of the 15th century. The local church's painting of Mary, known as Our Lady of Šiluva, was venerated far and wide. The Reformation in the 1500's led to Calvinists taking over the church's property. Catholics tried to regain the land for the church, to no avail. In 1608, according to church history, "Shepherd boys grazing their flock on what had been church lands saw a girl with flowing hair on a large rock. She was holding a child in her arms and weeping. One boy ran to tell a Calvinist catechist what he had seen. The Calvinist came and asked the girl, 'Why are you weeping?' The girl answered, 'I am weeping because once, at this place, my son was worshipped. Now they plow and sow here.' Having said this, she disappeared." Finally, in 1622, the land was restored to the Church. During 1918-1940 as many as

100,000 people each year participated in Šiluva devotions, held each year on September 8.

**78: 60ct The Hill of Crosses; flesh and grays (Mi # 534)**  
Printing: 500,000

The Pope stopped at the international symbol of resistance to communism, the Hill of Crosses, near Šiauliai, on September 7. Šiauliai is a city of over 100,000 in northern Lithuania, a cultural and industrial center whose roots go as far back as the 8th century. Some of the thousands of crosses on the hill were carved in the Soviet period when planting a cross would incur severe penalties from authorities. Four times, most recently in 1975, Soviets demolished the shrine, only to find that the crosses reappeared. The Pope's morning mass homily here began, "We come here, to the Hill of Crosses, to remember all the sons and daughters of your land, as well as those sentenced, those sent to prison, to concentration camps, deported to Siberia or to Kolyma and condemned to death." Just under 100,000 faithful attended.

**79: 80ct Panorama of Old Kaunas and the Church of St. George; flesh and salmon grays (Mi # 535)**  
Printing: 500,000

The Pope spoke to Lithuanian youth in Darius and Girenas stadium in Kaunas on September 6, and warned against embracing materialism and moral permissiveness, according to The Baltic Independent. In a sermon at an open-air mass at the meeting of the Neris and Nemunas rivers, he called for a new evangelism that would be appropriate to contemporary needs. 80% of all the police in Lithuania participated in special "Pope duty" during his visit.

**80: 80ct Vilnius, the Gates of Dawn; flesh and dark grays (Mi #536)**  
Printing: 500,000

The Aušros Vartai -- the Gates of Dawn Church in Vilnius -- and its painting, the Madonna of the Gates of Dawn, has been a famous shrine known for its healing power since the 17th century. Pilgrims and believers talk about the hundreds of miracles and rescues attributed to the painting, and say the site ranks with Fatima. The church is one of nine gates of the defensive wall built around Vilnius between 1503 and 1522. The Pope spoke here, in Lithuanian, Polish and Russian, on September 4. He called the church a place of great importance for pilgrims from Lithuania, Poland, Belarus and Ukraine. It is a place, he said, where all stand united in the presence of Mary and share a common hope.

### National Costumes of Dzukai, ca. 19th century

R. Lelytė designed three stamps continuing the folk costume series begun in October 1992 with three stamps illustrating costumes of the Suvalkiečiai, which she also designed. Dzukai and Suvalkiečiai together form Aukštaičiai, or High Lithuanian, as opposed to Žemaičiai, or Low Lithuanian. The biggest difference between the stamp sets, apart from the fact that the new issues are the first to come out of Moscow's Gosznak printers, (the first set was printed in Leipzig), is the number of stamps printed. 1992's stamps were printed in runs of 1, 2 and 3 million, respectively. The new set's comparable runs are 500,000, 1 and 1 million. The new set was printed on white paper with shiny gum in sheets of 50, perforated 12 1/4. (Last year's set was perforated 13 x 13 3/4.)

**83: 1Lt Costumes; multicolored**  
Printing: 1,000,000

Dzukai are the inhabitants of eastern and southern Lithuania. Linguistically, they belong to the High Lithuanian dialect group. One of the hallmarks of their language is that "d" is sometimes replaced by "dz," as in Dzievas instead of Dievas (God). The heart of the area where this dialect is spoken is the shores of the Nemunas and Merkine rivers. The principal towns are Alytus, Lazdija, Merkine, Varena and Valkininkai. Dzukai have a strong community streak and adhere to the old ways for marriage, funerals, some holidays and farm work.

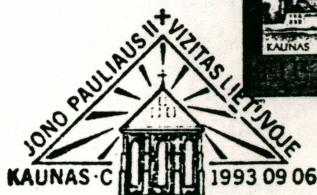
- SC61. September 3, 1993, "Premier Jour," Vilnius-C.** Crucifix surrounded by circular lettering, commemorating the first day of Pope John Paul II's visit to Lithuania. Used, as were special cancels 62-65, all designed by J. Zovė, with stamp #'s 77-80. Pašto Zenklas also issued 600,000 cacheted unstamped envelopes and 500,000 cacheted unstamped postcards, also designed by Zovė.
- SC62. September 4-5, 1993, "John Paul II's Visit to Lithuania," Vilnius-C.** Triangular cancel, Gates of Dawn church.
- SC63. September 6, 1993, "John Paul II's Visit to Lithuania," Kaunas-C.** Triangular cancel, St. George's church.
- SC64. September 7, 1993, "John Paul II's Visit to Lithuania," Siauliai-C.** Triangular cancel with Hill of Crosses.
- SC65. September 7, 1993, "John Paul II's Visit to Lithuania," Šiluva.** Triangular cancel, Chapel of the Apparition of Mary.
- SC66. September 23, 1993, "50th Anniversary of the Destruction of the Vilnius Ghetto," Vilnius-C.** Star of David within circular cancel, designed by I. Zibucas. No P-Ž stamp or envelope.
- SC67. October 3-9, 1993, "International Letter Writing Week," Vilnius-C.** Circular date stamp with post horn, identical to SC60, designed by K. Katkus, which was used July 21, 1993 in Vilnius with the "A" and "B" stamps. No P-Ž stamp or envelope.
- SC68. October 28, 1993, "200th Anniversary of the Birth of Simonas Daukantas," Vilnius-C.** Circular date stamp surrounding open book, identical to SC51, used March 13 in Vilnius for the first day of issue of the Daukantas stamp, #67 (Sc #446, Mi #523). (See Bulletin # 165, page 9194, for information on Daukantas.) The special cancel was designed by A. Ratkevičiene, as was the stamp. No P-Ž envelope.
- SC69. October 30, 1993, "Premier Jour," Vilnius-C.** Decorative horse collar (?) cancellation, used in conjunction with stamp #'s 81-83 which illustrate the folk costumes of Dzukai. The cancel, but not the stamps, was designed by K. Paškauskas. P-Ž also issued 450,000 cacheted, unstamped, envelopes, designed by R. Aranauskas.

The auction will include all Lithuania related items as determined by the Auction Manager.

1. Only LPSNY members in good standing are eligible to participate in auctions.
2. Only lots with a minimum estimated value of \$1.00 will be accepted. A lot may consist of more than one item.
3. All lots will be sold to the highest bidder at a slight advance over the second highest bid: to \$5.00 by \$.25; to \$10.00 by \$.50; to \$25.00 by \$1.00; to \$50.00 by \$2.50; above \$50.00 by \$5.00 increments. Bids not in accordance with the above will be reduced to the nearest bid.
4. The Auction Manager and/or seller reserve the right to withdraw and lot prior to sale, or to group two or more lots.
