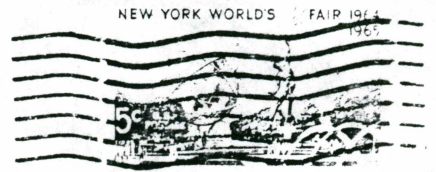
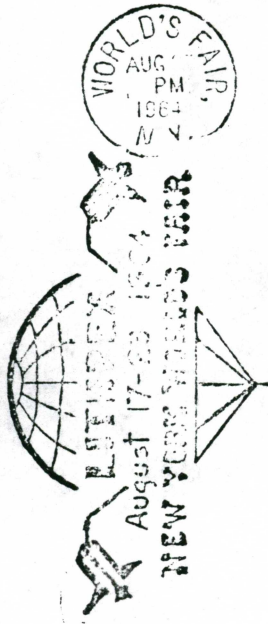

40th Anniversary Commemorative Envelopes

Lithuanian Town Cancellations of July 1, 1919 - 1941: Updating a Reverse List

The impetus for this article was the realization that Walter Norton's list of Lithuanian post offices in reverse -- in backwards order by the last four letter of the name, published in the LPSNY Bulletin of January, 1965, # 42, is, by now, seriously incomplete. It has been an invaluable aid to me -- and I'm certain to many LPSNY members -- in helping to identify partial cancels on Lithuanian stamps of 1918 - 1941.

How to update that landmark list? Look to the other giants in the field: Matuzas and Fugalevičius. I took first the comprehensive list of Lithuanian post offices compiled and published by Charles Matuzas beginning in the LPSNY Bulletin of February, 1963, # 36, and compared that list first with Norton's (put into straight alphabetical order).

Then that combined list was compared with Vytautas Fugalevičius' "Bible:" "Pašto Antspaudai" (P.O. Cancels), 1990 (and a subsequent update).

Once a more comprehensive list than any of those three individually had been created (see the article immediately following for the new straight checklist), I reversed the order. This new reverse list is roughly three times the size of Walter Norton's. (Thank you to Vytautas Valantinas for his assistance in helping me find examples of cancels. Back issues of the LPSNY Bulletin are available from Vince Alones for \$2.50 each, postpaid; no serious cancellation collector can afford to be without Fugalevičius' book. I can pass on your letter of inquiry to him.)

The ideal introduction to the subject of Lithuanian cancellation collecting? Walter Norton's introduction to his reverse list -- still as interesting and timely now as it was 30 years ago. It is reprinted below with minor editing. The updated reverse list follows. As Walter Norton said, "Happy Hunting!"

Lithuanian Town Cancellation Collecting by W.E. Norton

This is a field that can be enjoyed by all collectors of Lithuanian postage stamps. Even the most advanced collector will find a new use for his used duplicates. In this collection, the basic Lithuanian postage stamp is but the medium for carrying the Lithuanian town cancellation; therefore, the postage stamp's catalog value has only a secondary significance -- the town's cancellation is the center of attraction.

Cancellations themselves are of many types, varieties and classifications: from manuscript to straight-line provisional, to boxed, to circular, to oval and to specials. Each town may even have had its provisionals as well as regular official cancels together with its official post office seal that occasionally got used in the cancellation of the regular postage stamps.

Through the years, each town may have used up, worn out and replaced some of their cancellators with new and altered designs. It also appears that many post offices had in use more than one cancellator simultaneously, which can usually be identified by the subscript letter located in the lower half of the cancel. These subscript letters occasionally may be in either capital or lower-case letters, or may be left out. Some cancellators had a rosette and no letter. Others had abbreviations

of agencies: e.g., *PA* (Pašto Agentūra). A few towns may have had a numeral: e.g., "Nr. 2." Others had a numeral and a letter, as "1-c" or "1-f." It would be of interest to know the significance of these various subscript letters and combinations. Some of the smaller provincial towns also had their district's name added to the name of the town, as "SEINU APSKR."

As space fillers, ornamental designs are usually found in the lower half of the cancel. There must be at least 50 varieties of these designs: from a simple or outlined cross, to five- or six-pointed rosettes, and compound crosses made up of six or eight "V's," triangles or arrowheads, etc. Some of these ornaments are very large. Circle borders may be single-, double- or triple-lined, with or without bridges and bars.

Lithuanian cancellators were usually made up of lettering without any serifs and were usually in the Lithuanian language. There are several exceptions: in Cyrillic characters used in late 1918 and early 1919, we find Grodno and Lunna. In Gothic characters in the same period, we find Wilna and Retowo. The letters of the straight-line rubber stamp early provisional cancels usually had serifs. Some cancels, as Grodno, Lunna and post office seals, were undated.

The oval cancels were usually found on railroad cancellations and were also used for special events such as the Telšiai Philatelic Exhibition (St. Casimir's Fair), Scout Jamboree, Olympics, Basketball, etc. The railroad cancels usually carried a rail car (Pašto Vagonas) number as well as a subscript "a" or "b."

The ideal way to collect cancellations is to find them on cover, lightly and neatly canceled. The next best is to find them canceled in the center of a block of four, or a pair, or even a bulls-eye cancel on a single piece, or on a stamp of sufficient size to legibly show the full cancel: name of town, full date, subscript, ornaments, bridge, bars, border lines, etc.

However, such are the ideals to aim at! Unfortunately, the average collector will have to settle, quite often, for much less than a 100% cancel until the ideal collectible one comes along. The Bulletin is publishing an alphabetical list of town names of the various post offices that have had existence in Lithuania (by Matuzas), so that if you have the first part of the name on the cancel, you can then usually fix the balance of the name from the list.

Often, however, only the last half of the name is on the cancel, and, even then, from that portion you can also fix the name of the post office if there are enough letters to go by.

By the way, in how many different letters of the alphabet do you think the names of the various towns of Lithuania end in? I bet you can't even guess close! The Lithuanian alphabet has less than 26 letters. How many of them appear as the last letter in the names of the town cancellation? Do you think, About half of them, or say, 12? That might sound reasonable! Or, to be tighter, you might say a third, or eight of them? No, that is still twice too many. Actually, all Lithuanian town place names end in but one of four letters: A, E, I or S. This surprised me, and I know it should surprise you.

To help the cancellation collector to identify the Lithuanian post office town names when you have but the last part of the name on the cancel, I have prepared the following list indexed by the last four letters of the town name backwards with the addendum of the balance of the town name as you are accustomed to seeing it normally. No town has less than four letters in its name and you will find about seven of these.

Many of the towns had but few varieties of cancels during their period of existence, but a city like Kaunas had possibly more than 100. **HAPPY HUNTING TO YOU CANCELLATION COLLECTORS!**

Checklist of Lithuanian Town Cancellations: July 1, 1919 - August 21, 1940

My updating of lists compiled by, first, Charles Matuzas (LPSNY Bulletins # 36 - 42, February 1963 to January 1965), then Walter Norton (Bulletin # 42), and finally by Vytautas Fugalevičius in 1990 and in an update to his landmark book, was an outgrowth of wanting to update Walter Norton's reverse list of cancellations.

Mr. Norton's list had no stated qualifications as to inclusion, but anyone attempting to create an all-inclusive list is faced with that problem: what *are* the qualifications for inclusion? Do you, for instance, include manuscript cancels? Cyrillic cancels? Gothic-script cancels? Wilna? Lunna? Grodno? Do you list all spelling varieties? All sub-stations within a large city?

Ultimately, *all* qualifications are arbitrary and can be disputed -- and I expect no less and no more in our members' reaction to this checklist. The discussion I hope it will generate will be positive for Lithuanian philately.

Here's what seemed logical to me:

1. Approach the list from a collector's point of view -- the list should be a usable checklist that will encourage collectors to reexamine their holdings, and to consider chasing cancels they don't already have.
2. Variations in Lithuanian town spelling are collectible variations worth listing.
3. Major sub-stations in Kaunas deserve their own listing, those of smaller towns don't.
4. Forget Cyrillic- and Gothic-script versions of post office names, or post office cancellations that existed only in such versions.
5. Charles Matuzas, in his 1963 article, listed the 71 official Lithuanian post offices, from an official government notice originally published July 1, 1919. That seemed a logical place to begin, and the first Russian occupation during WWII seemed a good place to end -- that eliminates clearly Russified, Polonized and Germanized name variations of post offices. (Some of those founding post offices still have no known cancels!)
6. Eliminate railroad, maritime, machine, commemorative and military cancels.
7. Consider Fugalevičius' landmark book the starting point, and forget about whether Matuzas or W. Norton knew about Fugalevičius' listed cancellations.

So what's left? **937** listings: 224 more than Charles Matuzas' list alone, 302 more than Walter Norton's reverse list alone (of course, in a reverse list, all cities with the exact same name are counted only once, something that happens 14 times in my list -- in one such instance unpublished by Fugalevičius), and 106 more than Vytautas Fugalevičius' book (very narrowly defined) alone.

Utilizing the published research done by all three, I have attempted to make the checklist a path to further research by our members:

1. When it has been reported that slightly different spellings are but variations of the same town's name, I have noted that fact.
2. When such a spelling variation is reportedly an older variation, I have noted that fact.
3. When similarities in spelling between two different towns may mislead you into believing that they may be the same town, I have noted the different counties in which they are located. Such clarifications await completeness by a future philatelist.
4. When the cancels are unpublished by Fugalevičius, I have tried to indicate the county of origin to aid collectors in searching for examples.
5. The listings are in different type styles to give you additional information. Type styles and counts:

- 817 Kirdeikiai: (Normal or Plain style): Fugalevičius lists, and has published the cancel.
- Kybartai*: (Any listing with asterisk): one of the 71 original post offices, as per Matuzas.
- 14 **Kirtimai** : (**Bold**): Only Fugalevičius lists, but although he believes a cancellation exists, he has not yet published an example.
- 21 **Kulsutuva**: (**Underlined Bold**): Only Matuzas lists as a known cancel.
- 49 **Balčiai**: (**Two Underlines, Bold**): Only W. Norton lists as a known cancel.
- 36 **Kyburiai**: (**Bold Italic**): Both (but only) Matuzas and W. Norton list as a known cancel.

So why does W. Norton, with the smallest list, have more unique listings in my checklist than does Matuzas? It could be that he simply had more unique cancels. (Our Editor believes that Walter Norton did not attempt to keep Fugalevičius up to date on his finds.) It could also be that Walter Norton had the most inaccurate spelling, and that some of what I have called his "unique" listings are simple misspellings. Right now, there's no telling, so, while I have corrected a few, what seemed to me obvious, misspellings in the published lists of all three philatelic giants, I have retained those spellings that look like they just might be legitimate variations.

We know of the 71 original post offices -- but just how many were there later? And how many had cancellators? Charles Matuzas, in his May 1963 article in our Bulletin:

"The numerals after the district names ... denote the number of post offices, agencies and substations at the beginning of 1937 as supplied by the Postal Administration. The substations had no cancellators of their own -- the mail they received was forwarded to agencies for cancellation. Breaking down the numbers, there were 260 post offices, 424 agencies and 238 substations, adding up to 922. On average, one post office served 2,740 people living in an area of 60.9 square kilometers." Possibly 684 unique cancels, then.

Matuzas' February 1963 Bulletin introduction to his multi-part article "Lithuania's Post Office Cancellations" is still a wonderful way to begin a study:

"For the advanced collector specializing in Lithuania, the post office cancellations are pretty interesting. Take, for instance, the early typeset issues. Some came with straight-line cancellations, others with circular ones, in black, violet or blue inks in a conglomeration of languages: Russian, German, Lithuanian and Polish.

"All are witnesses to the awakening of an old nation into a new republic, and the quick transition of the countryside, with its burgeoning hamlets, villages, towns and cities. The mushrooming of its post offices in the ever-expanding postal system is the main gist of this article, in which we shall try to give those who are already collecting cancellations, or on the road to start, some pegs to hang on to, some lines to fill in, some jigsaw puzzles and crossword puzzles to rearrange to their true position, or to solve the unknown..."

The Lithuanian alphabet, not the English, was used to determine the order in the checklist which follows. The Lithuanian sequence is slightly different from the English sequence, and Č, Š and Ž are considered entirely separate letters:
